 will be transferred from donations into the operating budget so that Cara can begin
 purchasing new audiobooks.
- Susan moved to add the director's report to the minutes. Jen seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

New Business: Monthly tasks are up to date. Susan moved to accept any and all donations. Jen seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

Director's Report - 1.10.18

Circulation & Usage Statistics

- The gate count for December, 2,377, fell significantly by 1,000 from November and we closed out the year about 1,000 less than 2016. The monthly fall in numbers may be attributed to the holiday season, a snow storm, extremely cold weather, three additional days closed, and decreased story time attendance.
- Although our overall circulation decreased slightly from 2,669 to 2,232, the number of Overdrive checkouts saw its highest numbers since the summer, 341. This may be attributed to the lower gate count and foot traffic in the library. Also, story time and LEGO club were on break during the last 2 weeks of December.

- Website traffic Total site views per month:

Programming

- Children's programs saw a decrease in attendance throughout December.
 - O Story time attendance experienced a large drop off, particularly the baby group. Robin has reached out to parents to determine how we can better accommodate this group.
 - O Unfortunately, none of the story time groups have very many children registered for the upcoming session beginning January 16th.
 - O The elementary paint sessions with Chris Arnold was a huge success! The middle school group did not have as much interest, however we believe changing the time of the program would accommodate more kids.
 - Our school vacation week programs (story time, movie, mini golf) saw decent attendance, but not as high as we had hoped. More marketing through the school may increase awareness.
- Adult program attendance remained solid, yet fewer programs were offered.
 - o Both the afternoon and evening book groups maintain their loyal following, are well-attended and always a lively discussion.
 - o The NH Weather with Josh Judge was a very fun event. The kids in attendance outnumbered the adults and we had 35 in attendance.
 - Our monthly game hour for adults was reintroduced in November and it held strong into December with 12 attendees. It's an enthusiastic group and they enjoy being in the meeting room, as opposed to the first floor.
 - O The monthly Overdrive workshops began in December with 5 in attendance, which was a fantastic start. We hope this will create more awareness and encourage more people to utilize this service.
- Upcoming programs in January:
 - Our new book groups, Family and Cookbook, have their first meetings in January.
 - The middle school group has received a solid interest, 7 students, and their kickoff event is January 25th. Dan Bunker has planned an exciting 'escape the library' event for the kids.
 - o Story time and LEGO club begin January 16th.
 - o Resident James Patrick Kelly is offering a 2 part flash fiction writing workshop.
 - Our bi-monthly documentary film is back this month with "The Boys of '36".

Technology

• With the installation of the new TV in the meeting room, are there any thoughts or ideas about the current, smaller TV? Could we utilize it elsewhere in the library?

Banking/Financials

- During December the library received a few monetary donations:
 - o \$500 Specifically for audio books
 - o \$25 Specifically for books
 - o \$500 General donation Could we use a portion of this to get our downloadable (Overdrive) collection started?
- Should we make the transfers into the Operating account now?

Staffing

• Although this year's budgeting is done, could we begin discussions of reinstating the part-time children's librarian position?

Trustees

- Allison Friend-Gray's term is up in March 2018, she plans to run again.
- We have one alternate position open.

Collection

• The Overdrive Advantage initial setup is complete and included 3 e-book titles. No further items have been purchased. Do we have a specific total or percentage of items we'd like added per month?

Meeting Room

• The new TV should be delivered this week. Joe Medeiros and Dick Blouin will mount the TV on the wall. The electrician, Alan from Epping Electric, will then come and install power.

Furniture

• There's been preliminary discussions about rearranging the first floor, is there an objection of removing the display case from the library?

Building/Grounds Maintenance

- The broken window in the front of the library is repaired.
- The lectern and cabinet door in the office were repaired by Steve Costain.
- There are a few sections of trim in the front of the building that need replacing. (Leaving this in the report until the spring as a reminder.)

Policies & Procedures

• Would we like to consider rewording the library's mission statement?
