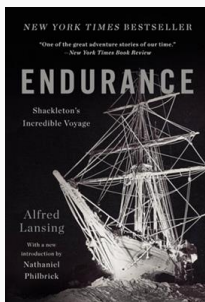
The Holidays on the Horizon

Book Groups

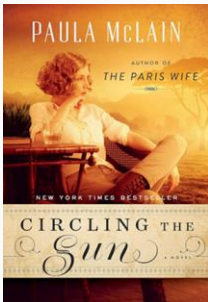
