Spring Has Arrived


The trees bud, the flowers bloom, and BML programming resumes!

Every month through spring and summer, BML is showcasing somewhere you can visit with a <u>library museum pass!</u> This month's highlight is the <u>Aviation Museum of New Hampshire</u> in Londonderry, NH. Offering free admission for up to 4 people, it makes for an unique adventure for the whole family!

The Aviation Museum is particularly great for kids who have an interest in planes, offering **hands-on learning** for younger kids every Friday until 4pm and a **special flight simulation** for those 13 and up every Saturday between 1pm and 4pm. Of course, any time you can drop by to learn all about the history of aviation and watch planes land and take off in person!
